

Everyone who is pleased with God's marvelous deeds will keep them in mind.

There is much to give thanks for the Lord's leading and provision this past year. For instance: new graduates through the ACOM program of training pastors and ministry leaders in East and South Asia including ASOM in the Philippines. As well as a new ACOM in Thailand. Some of these graduates go on to serve with AEFI in mission and evangelistic work building contextual openings to live and share the gospel. Many pastors go to serve in remote places such as Kalimantan, Indonesia, and East Java where the pastors are supported by sustainable farming and rearing goats. Church planting initiatives are starting and developing in East and South Asia such as, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nepal, the Philippines, and Thailand. The vision is to see 50 new Christ communities of faith over the next ten years.







The Lord has been very kind and merciful to AEFI. We have seen many people coming to know and trust in Him. New believers are being encouraged and supported in their new faith. Children, young people, families, and older people are cared for and discipled through ministries such as medical, children, and church planting with AEF Cambodia, outreach to the indigenous people groups in Malaysia (Orang Asli) and the Philippines (Dumagat), culinary training for young people in Nepal, and missionaries in Myanmar, South and North-East India. With all this activity and initiatives AEFI need new supporters and churches to pray, share, and financially support the mission. Please share the work of AEFI to inspire others of what the Lord is doing in Asia.

Anyone who belongs to Christ is a new person. The past is forgotten, and everything is new. God has done it all! He sent Christ to make peace between himself and us, and he has given us the work of making peace between himself and others. 2 Corinthians 5:17-18 (cf. Isaiah 65:17)

Shepherd Leadership: East Asia Leaders' Consultation



John 21:15 When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' 'Yes, Lord,' he said, 'you know that I love you.'

Jesus said, 'Feed my lambs.'

16 Again Jesus said, 'Simon son of John, do you love me? 'He answered, 'Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.'

In keeping with the shepherd's role as leader and protector, the third East Asia Consultation (Siem Reap, Cambodia 30 Oct-04 Nov) was a rich time of teaching, national ministry reporting and case studies. The mission work of East Asia in Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand was reflected upon for learning and prayer. The teaching was rooted in the care and compassion of the divine shepherd and the dependence of leaders on Him to meet all their needs.

This vital gathering of East Asia leaders has been long anticipated. The Cambodian hosts thoroughly prepared a full program that included opportunities for informal meetings to share with one another. Making connection through teaching, prayer, and worship, and outlining the unique national ministries, was refreshing, and edifying. Fellow leaders were able to hear of the struggles and joys of their ministries. Such as the isolated pastors in the field for the long-term. They are the least expensive and most relevant to their contexts because they live alongside local people weaving the gospel into everyday life.
